Dr. Johanna L. Waters

Associate Professor in Human Geography

Fellow of Kellogg College, University of Oxford

Johanna Waters is an Associate Professor in Human Geography at the University of Oxford, who specialises in migration, transnationalism and (international) education. Her work has focused, largely, on East Asia and on trans-Pacific educational mobilities. She has researched 'split families' and the transnational dispersal of households as they accumulate types of 'capital' at different global sites. She has also focused, specifically, on university students and recent graduates, to explore the role that mobility plays in their educational and employment experiences. She has recently completed a large study on transnational education in Hong Kong and is just embarking on a project on cross-border schooling (daily commuting across state boundaries for education).
